• **Javier Bardem** (March 1, 1969) – from *No Country for Old Men* (2007), where he plays the chilling antagonist Anton Chigurh: "What's the most you ever lost on a coin toss?"

• **Daniel Craig** (March 2, 1968) – from Casino Royale (2006): "The name's Bond. James Bond."

- **Bruce Willis** (March 19, 1955) *Die Hard* (1988): "Yippee-ki-yay"
- **Reese Witherspoon** (March 22, 1976) from Legally Blond (2001:"Exercise gives you endorphins. Endorphins make you happy. Happy people just don't shoot their husbands."
- Quentin Tarantino (March 27, 1963) from *Kill Bill: Volume 1* (2003), spoken by Uma Thurman's character, The Bride: "Revenge is a dish best served cold."
